HOW CAN WE STAY SAFE ONLINE?





Try not to use the same password twice.

When coming up with passwords, try not to use the same password for different accounts. This prevents people from figuring them out easily.

Never give out private information online.

Sharing private information, such as your home address, phone number and school name is dangerous! Unless your parents/guardian have given you permission, do not share this information with anyone online.





Always ask an adult for permission.

You should always ask for your parents' permission before going online. Let them know which website or app you are going on. Remember to also ask them for permission if you want to create an account or purchase something.

Report unkind behaviour

If you see someone being unkind online, try to get them to stop by telling them what they are doing is wrong. By doing so, you are caring for other internet users in the community. Most kids may panic in an emergency. But not the plucky Sahanna D/O Ramash.

Last April, Sahanna, then seven, was playing at home when she noticed the smell of smoke. Curious, she went to investigate. That's when she found that it was coming from her neighbour's flat. Nobody was home at the time.

"I ran to inform my mummy, and after that, I called the police. I told them the emergency and my address," said Sahanna. It was the first time she had ever dialled 999.

Sahanna explained that she had known what to do, all because she had paid attention in class.

"My teacher told us that in an emergency, we should call 999 for the police and 995 for an ambulance," she recalled.

Thanks to Sahanna's quick thinking, the firefighters arrived within minutes. They managed to contain the fire before it got any bigger.

That night, Sahanna's grateful neighbours thanked her for her heroic assistance.

Another neighbour even nominated her for the Good Neighbour Award (GNA). It recognises residents who go above and beyond the call of neighbourly duty.

Sahanna won in the Student Category (Primary) and accepted her award in school.
